### A Note on Today's Music:

Maurice Ravel wrote his *Sonatine* between 1903 and 1905 when he was encouraged by a friend to enter a composition contest for the Parisian magazine, *Weekly Critical Review*. The competition had very specific rules regarding the structure of submissions, and so Ravel's final work was "made to order" in a way that most of his pieces weren't. After it premiered in 1906, it was well-received and has become a favorite of the French repertoire.
